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“HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE  
CHANCERY DIVISION  
(before MR. JUSTICE NORTH)  
GLASSE V. WOOLGAR

The plaintiff had agreed to take a window in the defendant's premises, 58, Fleet-street, for June 22 for the purpose of using it as a place to see the Royal Diamond Jubilee procession from. It was said that the defendant had repudiated the agreement setting up objections on the part of his landlord, to whom he now wished to let the window.

Mr. LAVINGTON moved on behalf of the plaintiff to restrain the defendant from letting the window to any one but himself.

Mr. F. St. John Morrow, for the defendant, was not called upon by

His LORDSHIP, who dismissed the motion on the ground that it was not a case for an injunction: if the plaintiff had any ground of complaint he could get other seats and sue for any excess of price by way of damages.”
