"POLICE

At BOW-STREET yesterday, before Mr. Marsham, JOSEPH CASDEREK, 30, an Austrian, was charged on remand with stealing an overcoat from the Vienna Café, New Oxford-street. The prisoner is the man who escaped from Bow-street while he was awaiting his turn to appear before the magistrate. He was now further charged with stealing an overcoat belonging to Mr. Morris Woolgar from Frascati's Restaurant, Oxford-street, and with stealing on March 14 a letter containing a cheque for £1l 5s. from the letter-box of Messrs. S. B. Bolas and Co., photographic surveyors, Oxford-street. There was a further charge against him of forging and uttering this cheque. When arrested he was found to be in possession of a piece of string to which was attached a weight covered with a sticky substance. On the same day that the cheque was missed he purchased with it a pair of 10s. 6d trousers from Samuel Lowenstein, tailor, of Tottenham-court-road, and was handed some change. The cheque was returned when Mr. Lowenstein presented it through his bank. The prisoner was committed for trial".
