“Pursuant to an Order of the High Court of Justice Chancery Division made in the matter of the Estate of George Benjamin Woolger deceased in a Cause George Goodwin on behalf of himself and all other the unsatisfied Creditors of the said deceased against Eliza Woolger (Widow) and another 1876 W. No. 427. The Creditors of George Benjamin Woolger late of “The Cricketers Inn” Chertsey in the County of Surrey publican who died in or about the month of April 1876 are on or before the twenty seventh day of June 1877 to send by post prepaid to Mr. Ambrose Haynes a member of the firm of Ambrose Haynes and Sons of Grecian Chambers Devereux Court Temple in the City of London the solicitors of the Defendant Eliza Woolger (Widow) the administratrix of the said George Benjamin Woolger deceased their Christian and Surnames addresses and descriptions, the full particulars of their Claims, a statement of their Accounts and the nature of the securities (if any) held by them. Or in default thereof they will be peremptorily excluded from the benefit of the said Order. Every Creditor holding any security is to produce the same before the Master of the Rolls at his Chambers situated in the Rolls Yard Chancery Lane Middlesex on Thursday the twelfth day of July 1877 at 11 o'clock in the forenoon being the time appointed for adjudicating on the claims. Dated this 26<sup>th</sup> day of May 1877.”
