

Philip Woolger of Plumpton, Bankruptcy Notice

“Notice is hereby given, that by indenture, bearing date the 14th day of April, 1830, and made between Philip Woolger, of Plumpton, in the county of Sussex, farmer, of the first part, George Harman, of Lewes, in the said county, builder, and Stephen Duplock, of the same place, plumber and glazier, (creditors of the said Philip Woolger), of the second part, and the several other persons executing the same (also creditors of the said Philip Woolger), of the third part, the said Philip Woolger hath conveyed and assigned all his Estate and effects whatsoever to the said George Harman and Stephen Duplock, as trustees upon trust, for the benefit of all the creditors of the said Philip Woolger: and that the said indenture was executed, by the said Philip Woolger and George Harman on the said 14th day of April, and by the said Stephen Duplock on the 28th day of April aforesaid, which several executions were witnessed by Thomas Cooper, of Lewes, aforesaid, attorney at law.”
