Mary, my wife

In the Name of God Amen I John Woolgar of River in the parish of Tillington in the County of Sussex Bricklayer being infirm in Body but of sound and disposing mind memory and Understanding Do make and declare this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say, After recommending my Soul unto Almighty God and my Body to the Earth I dispose of my Worldly Estate as follows vizt First Whereas I have surrendered into the hands of the Lord of the Manor of River All that my Customary Messuage or Tenement Barn Garden Orchard and certain Customary Lands thereunto belonging with the Appurtenances called Fosters situate lying and being in the parish of Tillington to the use of my Will Now I do by this my last Will and Testament give and devise unto my Wife Mary Woolgar and her heirs forever All the said Messuage or Tenement Barn Garden Orchard Lands Hereditaments and premises with the Appurtenances and all other my Real Estate whatsoever Also I give and bequeath unto my said wife Mary Woolgar All my Household Goods and Furniture and all other my personal Estate whatsoever and wheresoever of what nature or kind soever it may be and do appoint her my said Wife Mary Executrix of this my last Will and Testament But I earnestly recommend it to her that if she should have anything to leave at the time of her Death that she do leave the same be it what it may whether little or much equally amongst all my children In Witness whereof I the said John Woolgar the Testator have to this my last Will and Testament set my hand and seal this Seventh day of May in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety Four John Woolgar his mark [seal] Signed sealed published and declared by the said John Woolgar the Testator as and for his last Will and Testament in the presence of Thomas Pearce John Sanders Wm Johnson
